CURRENT SITUATION:

Ensure equity for all pupils

The 'Ensure Equity for all Pupils' workstream met on 20th October 2023 at Cwrtnewydd. The workstream received a presentation on the 'Sgiliau Bywyd, Sgiliau Gwaith' which is the alternative curriculum provision delivered by Lifelong Learning and Skills Service, for disengaged learners in Key Stage 4 The aims of this alternative curriculum provision is to o ensure that the most vulnerable / at risk learners:

- Have access to a bespoke Alternative Curriculum to meet their needs
- Have the skill sets required to contribute to the local economy
- Have the best opportunity to achieve and reach their full potential
- Improve their attainment and attendance
- Develop social, emotional and behavioural skills
- Leave school with relevant qualifications.

There are currently 102 pupils enrolled on the provision. The Alternative Curriculum is currently funded via the UK Shared Prosperity Funding, which ends 31st December 2024.

Year 9,10,11 pupils that are at risk of disengaging from education are eligible to attend the alternative curriculum. This cohort are identified through RAG/VAP scores, referrals through school, other internal services or outside agencies

The following qualifications can be achieved. All BTEC Level 1 Introductory Certificates are equivalent to 2 GCSE's (D-G).
